



- **Grand Rounds**: Our program hosts a guest lecturer to present information related to their field. This ranges from a medical specialty, specific extraordinary cases, legal and financial information within the medical field, wellness and health of medical professionals, among others. This is a CME approved activity.
- **Tumor Board**: Held once per quarter. This meeting details cases performed within the hospital involving residents in our program. Presentations go over the nature of these cases, the patient's historical information as it relates, and a breakdown of the performance of the case itself, all with discussion, notes, and relevant background of the procedures by the attendings. This is a CME approved activity and a Quality Improvement item via guidelines of the ACGME. It is a multidisciplinary lecture attended by the operating surgeons, radiologists, oncologists, and pathologists.
- **SCORE Curriculum**: Our program provides access to the SCORE educational modules and True learn. As part of the educational meetings, residents will cover modules to go over questions, compare notes, and conduct a group discussion on the answers.
- Journal Club: Once a month, residents present a series of published medical articles for review and discussion.



- How can I submit my application?
 - All applications to our program must be submitted through ERAS
- What are your program's application requirements?
 - Each cycle our program wishes to open applications to as wide a group as possible. We believe that strict requirements have the potential to dissuade or prevent an otherwise attractive candidate from entering our review pool. As such, our application requirements are as follows:
 - 3 Letters of Recommendation
 - Curriculum Vitae (CV)
 - Personal Statement
 - Medical School Graduate Transcripts and Diploma
 - Completion of Step 1 and Step 2 USMLE/COMLEX
 - We accept graduates from AOA and LCME accredited medical schools
 - We accept International Medical Graduates (IMGs) with proof of valid ECFMG certification
- Additional Application FAQ
 - We do not require prior residency training for PGY1 positions
 - We do not have a minimum exam score requirement beyond completion of step 1 and 2
 - We offer digital options for interviews typically Google Meets or Zoom
 - Not a requirement but we highly encourage to rotate with us



St John's Episcopal Hospital General Surgery Residency Program - FAQ

- How many residents does the program take each year?
 - 4 categorical positions. We do not offer preliminary positions
- What is the start date for newly hired residents?
 - Academic year begins on July 1st every cycle. New residents are contracted to begin on that date. There is an onboarding process that takes place during the last two weeks in June. All incoming residents should expect to be available for a combination of both digital and on-site training for orientation
- Is the program ACGME accredited?
 - Our program has full ACGME accreditation status
- Can you give examples of some of the educational content of the program?
 - There are four hours of protected education time each week on Fridays. This includes material from SCORE curriculum.
